

The nature of discovery

- The pursuit of fundamental principles
- The product of untargeted research
- Knowledge is limiting

Roles of government and industry

- Government support of basic research, due to the long time scale
- Small as well as large countries must foster basic research
- Retain local talent
- Support young scientists
- Industrial support of technological development

Science and society

- Science is international
- Knowledge, education will not suffice for addressing societal problems
- Basic science as a paradigm for solving societal problems

Science and religion

- Seek to explain mysteries of life
- Science provides explanations, often in abstract terms
- Science based on objective, verifiable truth
